

BRCS Clubs Policy Statement

BRCS students with special interests or common aims may be organized into clubs with specific purposes and programs with an adult advisor/sponsor/coach approved by the administration. The number and character of clubs will vary with changes in interests and demand. The clubs will be composed of students who are interested in such things as Christian service, recreation, particular hobbies, and special academic activities.

All groups of students or parents who wish to initiate a club or activity, supposedly under the jurisdiction of the school, or use the school name, must have approval from the BRCS administration and must have an advisor/sponsor/coach from the BRCS staff. If non-BRCS students are to be involved in the club, a BRCS hold harmless agreement must be completed and signed by the student/parents. Each club must have a written set of rules and regulations. All clubs must be financially self-supporting, and rental charges to use BRCS facilities will apply if BRCS facilities are needed for club activities. Please take note that the BRCS administration has the right not to sanction the club or to allow a club to use BRCS facilities if deemed appropriate.

Additional Items:

- Approved advisor/sponsor/coach must be present at all BRCS club meetings/practices/games/etc.
- There will be a minimal fee that BRCS will charge even if the club takes place completely off campus.
- Approved clubs will be placed on the BRCS website, listed under the club section with only the advisor's/ sponsor's contact name, phone number, and email address. Practices/games/ activities will not be uploaded to the website.
- If transportation is needed, parents will be fully responsible for arranging rides.
